Got it. I do disconnect the sway bar links before corner weighting. the problem is that cars with the m030 front bar don't disconnect quite so easily. Also no adjustable links to take out preload. when i had that sway bar on my car, i just set the front coilovers to the same height and did all weight adjustments using the rear ride height adjustment thingies. Usually just adjusting one corner is enough. We should
