expensive at \$300 at the time, but very very nice. I got it in 2004 and it was good through 2009. I have been quite happy with it and will probably get another Schroth to replace it come 2009.

It is also SFI rated too, but NASA will accept the FIA cert for 5 years. I would never get another harness that was not at least FIA certified as well. No reason to throw away a good harness after just 2 years.
